

FIRE PROTECTION BYLAW

RURAL MUNICIPALITY OF RECIPROCITY No. 32

BYLAW NO. 5-24

The Council of the Rural Municipality of Reciprocity No. 32, in the Province of Saskatchewan, enacts as follows:

Short Title

1. This Bylaw may be cited as the Fire Protection Bylaw.

Definitions


2. In this Bylaw, the expressions:
 - (a) "a person" includes a corporation and the heirs, executors, administrators, or other legal representatives of a person;
 - (b) "municipality" shall mean The Rural Municipality of Reciprocity No. 32, of the Province of Saskatchewan;
 - (c) "call for service" shall mean any call, request or demand for services made pursuant to a contract entered into by the municipality pursuant to this bylaw or any bylaw repealed hereby, and any voluntary response by a person who provides prevention or suppression of fire services without request;
 - (d) "Fire Chief" shall mean the fire chief as appointed by resolution of the Rural Municipality of Reciprocity No. 32;
 - (e) "person or persons who receives the service" shall mean and include any registered owner, lessee or occupier of the land who was adversely affected by the fire for which a call for services was made and the person or persons responsible for causing or creating the fire.

Agreements

3. The municipality is authorized to enter into agreements for the receiving of fire fighting or fire prevention services or emergency services on any terms that may be agreed upon, including the payment of charges with any other municipal corporation.
4. The reeve or councillor of the municipality may, in the event of an emergency, contract on behalf of the municipality with any person to provide fire fighting or fire prevention services.

Costs

5. The municipality is authorized to pay for services provided pursuant to paragraphs 3 and 4 of this bylaw.
6. The municipality may levy a charge sufficient to defray the costs of fire protection.
7. The Fire Chief may cause the banning of any or all fires within the municipality if deemed necessary by the Fire Chief.
8. Bylaw 7-06 is hereby repealed as the original was lost in the fire March 16, 2022.
9. This bylaw shall come into force and take effect on the day of its final passing.
